MISSING FINISHING INSTRUCTION FROM THE ISSUE**

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Bee Keeper

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Finished size: 5.5 inches diameter

Instructions:

1. Transfer pattern to weavers cloth. Refer to instructions in this issue, if needed.
2. Put weavers cloth with design centered in hoop, gripper frame or staple to artist stretcher bars.
3. Set your punchneedle to lowest setting. Start punching the smallest elements first, then work out from there. For example, punch her eye, then punch her face. Once all the elements are punched, fill in the background.
4. NOTE: punch the bees wings last with only one punch.
5. Cut 2 circles from sticky board measuring 5 1/2 inches.
6. Lay your punch needle piece face down and adhere your sticky board to it. Trim off excess fabric leaving 1 inch around the piece.
7. Then cut from edge of fabric up to the sticky board 1 1/2 inch apart all the way around the circle.
8. Repeat steps 6 and 7 for your coordinating fabric.
9. Hot glue the fabric to the back of the sticky board on both pieces.
10. Hot glue the mini pom pom around the circle with the punch needle on it.
11. Hot glue the ribbon hanger to the back side of the circle with the coordinating fabric.
12. Hot glue the two circles together.
13. Make a bow with the ribbon and hot glue it to the hanger.
